## HOLIDAY PARTY with SILENT AUCTION

On November 28, the MRA-Chicago Chapter is having its annual Holiday Party at Chicago's famous Green Dolphin Street Restaurant.

For fiscal year 2005-06, the Greater Chicago Food Depository distributed over 40 million pounds of food through its network of 600 agencies -- the equivalent of more than 84,000 meals per day, 365 days a year.

Here is an example: A client comes to your facility; she has been traveling all week and her flight has been delayed. She rushes into the facility with a lot on her mind. How would she like to be treated upon arrival? The answer: Like you would treat a guest in your own home! Assess her needs: Does she need any refreshments

to start off with? Does she need any materials for the group? Besides the basic needs, a capable staff throughout the project is mandatory. Complete knowledge of the study's specs and the ability to act at a moment's notice are two attributes of a great staff.

Overall, they gave us the necessary tips and tricks to make every project a success. A big thanks to both Susan and Sarah for showing us how to WOW the client!
